1	Activities reflecting goals and objectives of the institution.	: A few notable activities which directly reflect our goals and objectives are detailed below : <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Nutan Mahavidyalaya always thrives to attain the goal of <u>"Excellence in Education"</u> through the implementation of Gunwatta Vikas Yojna (Quality Improvement Program)1. After having successfully implemented the scheme for nearly 25 years in science faculty, we have now extended it to Arts & Commerce faculty. The scheme certainly helped in improving our examination results, Due to our consistent good performance in public examinations. Our scheme is looked upon as a role model in the field of education at higher secondary level.• In our development proposals submitted to U.G.C. in X plan period, we have proposed the activity of "Examination reforms" under which we have arranged lectures by eminent persons associated with the work university examinations. These presentations are hoped to serve as the background paper for the university level conference on "Examination Reforms" to be organised next year.• Our N.S.S. Unit organised a number of community activities such as farmers meet, water shed development programme, Health & Diagnostic camp for rural masses etc. which directly reflect our goals and objectives.
2	New Academic Programmes initiated.	: In pursuance to the suggestions of NAAC Peer Team, our college submitted the proposal to the University for introducing two optional subjects. (i.e. Geography for Arts faculty and Computer Science for Science Faculty) However university authorities gave us affiliation for only one subject i.e. Geography. Accordingly we have introduced Geography as the optional subject for degree course in Arts faculty in the current academic year i.e. 2004-05. We propose to renew our bid for the new elective subject of Computer Science in Science Faculty in the coming academic year



3	Innovations in curricular design and transaction	:	Non autonomous status of our college does not permit much flexibility, so as to introduce any major innovation in curricular design.
4	Inter Disciplinary Programmes started.	:	Combination of elective subjects as prescribed in degree level courses of our university in Arts, Science and Commerce Faculty include a very few interdisciplinary courses. Hence we could not run such courses at U.G. level. However our existing degree level courses in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Economics, Political Science, Languages Commerce etc. do have a little interdisciplinary orientation.
5	Examination Reforms Implemented.	:	<p>Our efforts for introducing reforms in the present examination system are outlined below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We regularly conduct unit tests for all the classes, which ensures periodic assessment of students. • We have conducted term end examination for all the classes in the month of February. The term end examination covering the whole syllabus has certainly helped students to know about the pattern of question paper to be set in the university examination. The test has also helped them to get judgement regarding their preparation for the university examination. • Our college while submitting its proposal for Development Grants in X plan period to U.G.C., has earmarked a sum of Rs. 80,000/- for the project of "Examination Reforms" U.G.C. while approving our development proposals has actually sanctioned an amount of Rs. 55488/- for the implementation of the project. Under this project we have arranged lectures of a few eminent persons associated with the work of University Examination. These lectures are hoped to provide base information for the University Level Conference on "Examination Reforms" to be organised next year.

Institution helped the students in getting some job work. The revenue earned through job work was equally distributed amongst all the students who participated in the activity. The Scheme also helped students to earn through marketing of a rejuvenative tonic 'Chayanprash' manufactured by a local Doctor.
